


During this same granting period, one or more grants of up to \$5,000 will be awarded for permanent community

Billings Community Foundation constantly strives to develop partnerships that promote charitable giving and are a benefit to the community. Steve Wahrlich, owner of the Best Western Clocktower Inn, is a great example of charitable giving, specifically our four-legged friends!

Two years ago, Steve set up a donor advised fund, the Clocktower Inn Animal Fund, through BCF with the intention of supporting and promoting domestic pets in need, such as homeless and rescued pets and feral dogs and cats. Funds are used to support spay/neuter clinics, as well as any other event that may fit into the concept of helping dogs and cats find healthy and happy homes.

So how does Steve fund these efforts? Steve's hotel is pet friendly with a small fee charged to guests for this convenience. Steve then directs \$5 of that fee to the Clocktower Inn Animal Fund. That seemingly small amount adds up!

Grant Recipients Update

In June 2013, the Billings Community Foundation awarded 14 grants totaling \$15,500 to community nonprofits. Below is an update on three of our recipients. What a difference BCF makes in our communities!

Young Families Early Head Start

received a grant to provide mental health services for pregnant and parenting teens enrolled in the YFEHS Teen Parent Class. Executive Director Debbie Richert notes that the dynamic between the students and the mental health provider has generated positive outcomes for the teens and their young children.

The YWCA of Billings Employment and Training Center's grant helped fund "Putting the Pieces Together: Empowering Clients to Move Forward with their Training Goals." With our grant, seven women received careerfocused services. One woman was able to recertify as a CNA and another is attending the Pharmacy Tech program at Billings Community Education. Program Manager Sandy Feralio points out that by accessing training, these individuals are gaining skills that will greatly impact their lives for years to come.

Our grant to **Tumbleweed** helped them gather some much needed information about the seriousness of homeless youth in our community. With the help of two AmeriCorp VISTAs, Tumbleweed compiled a report based on a survey of 96 people in Billings between the ages of 13 and 21 who are homeless, couch surfing, or living away from home because of abuse or other issues. This information

Over the past two years, nearly \$3,500 has been awarded to animal welfare groups. These grants have been critical to the care, feeding, and health of many homeless and rescued pets.




